THE REVELRY MASKS THE HARSH  
CONDITIONS MANY REFUGEES FROM THE CIVIL  
WAR IN BURUNDI FACE.

NEARLY TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND OF  
THEM ARE STRUGGLING TO SURVIVE IN  
WESTERN TANZANIA.

THEY'VE FLED HERE TO ESCAPE THE  
WAR THAT HAS RAGED IN BURUNDI FOR SIX  
YEARS NOW.
